

Report from the Maryland Health Benefit Exchange about Maryland Health Connection, the state-based health insurance marketplace

BALTIMORE (August 1, 2014) — As of July 26, 2014, Maryland has surpassed 411,000 total enrollments, including qualified health plans through Maryland Health Connection and Marylanders who have gained Medicaid coverage in 2014.

Enrollment Activities

As we update MarylandHealthConnection.gov, Marylanders seeking health insurance should use the options below. Online enrollment will resume in November.

Marylanders can enroll year round in Medicaid or the Maryland Children's Health Insurance Program by applying online at https://www.marylandsail.org or by visiting a local connector entity, health department or department or department or department</a

Marylanders who are interested in buying health insurance or need to complete or change an existing application may visit a <u>navigator or insurance broker</u>. You can enroll in a qualified health plan or change plans before Nov. 15 if you have <u>special circumstances</u> like getting married, having a baby or losing other health coverage.

Development of the new IT platform, adopting the successful Connecticut model, continues to progress on track. System tests are underway as scheduled.

Enrollment Data

As of July 26, 2014, 332,504 individuals have gained Medicaid coverage in 2014 and remain active in Medicaid. This includes the 95,889 PAC enrollees who were automatically converted on January 1, 2014 to full Medicaid coverage.

Beginning this month, we will also report net changes in Medicaid enrollment. This figure takes into account the fact individuals lose Medicaid coverage because of changes in household, age, and income, as well as redeterminations. Compared to December 31, 2013, the net change in Medicaid enrollment as of July 26, 2014 is +273,245.

As of July 26, 78,930 individuals have enrolled in a qualified health plan.
